The Music Department would like a music sample to be at least five minutes in length but no more than ten minutes of your best performance. It's helpful to submit two contrasting pieces. Either a CD or DVD sample is acceptable but the Music Department would like the sample to be clearly marked as to what type it is. Please also clearly write your name, email address and kind of music (i.e. cello, vocal, et cetera) on the sample. The sample should be sent to the Admission Office.

All recorded information must be **postmarked no later than Wednesday, February 1, 2012**. Submissions should be sent to the same address as the application indicated below.

Audition Requirements:

Please prepare a solo or etude, not to exceed 8 minutes. Please be sure to bring music for the accompanists. If you wish to bring your own accompanist, that is fine.

Instrumentalists are not required to have accompaniment.

If you wish to have Franklin & Marshall supply an accompanist, please check here.

Vocalists, please prepare at least one art song.

Music for the accompanist must be submitted to Dr. Brian Norcross (Music Department, P.O. Box 3003, Lancaster, PA 17604-3003) **no later than Wednesday, February 1, 2012**.

If you are a composer: please submit a sample of your work by Wednesday, **February 1, 2012**. Submissions must include written materials, but can also include recordings.
