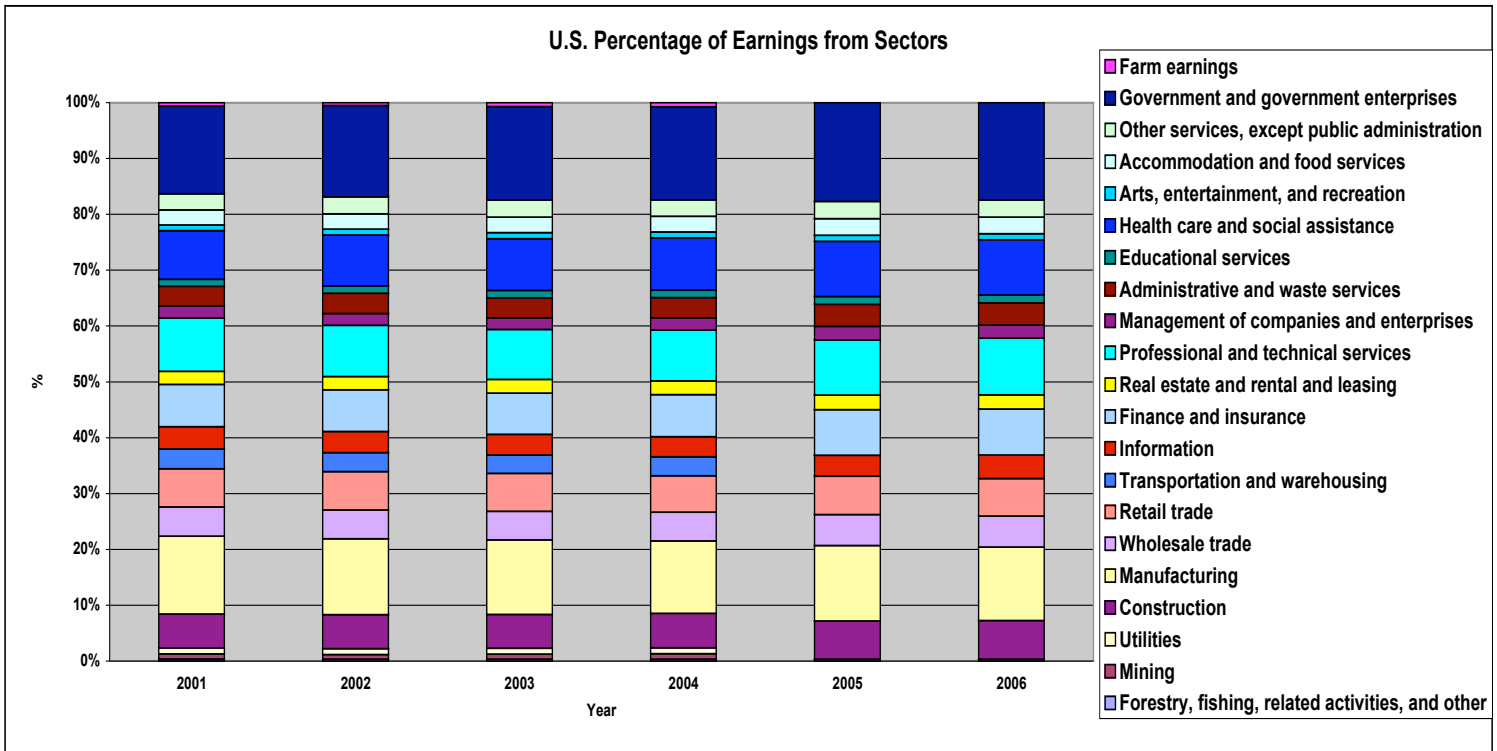


The Changing Structure of the U.S. Economy 2001-2006

The national trends in place in 1999 are basically continued from 2001 to 2006. The current economic crisis portends new, potentially very different, sectoral trends.

*These statistics follow the NAICS classification system and are thus not strictly comparable with pre-2000 values. In the NAICS classification system, the previously labeled "Services" and "F.I.R.E." sectors are divided up in the following ways:

Services: Information; Professional and Technical; Management of Companies and Enterprises; Administrative and Waste Services; Educational; Health Care and Social Assistance; Arts, Entertainment and Recreation; Accommodation and Food Services; Other Services except Public Administration

F.I.R.E.: Finance and Insurance; Real Estate, Rental, and Leasing
