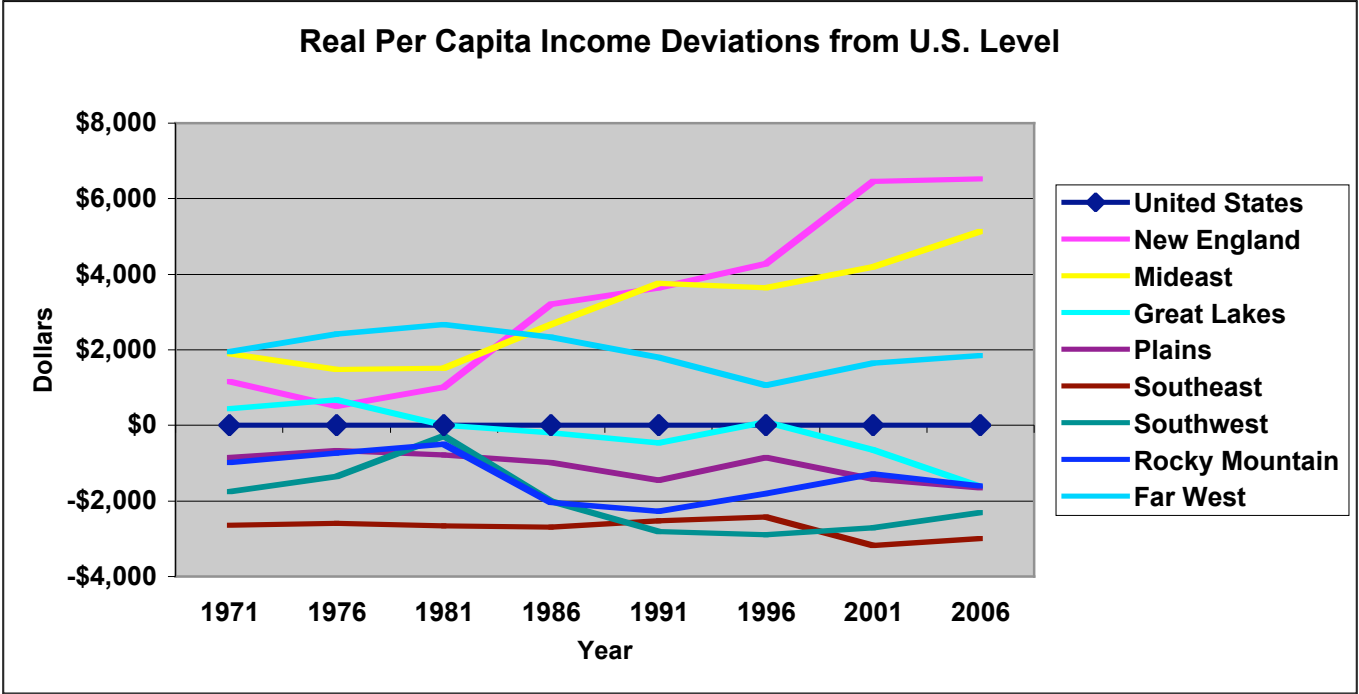


Deviations of Regional Real Per Capita Income from the U.S. Level (1971-2006)

Different regions of the U.S. have fared differently with respect to per-capita income growth. The New England and Mideast regions have seen increasing levels of real per-capita income with respect to the national level. The Plains, Rocky Mountain, Southeast, and Southwest regions have all remained below that of the national level.
