HISTORY *of the* COLLEGE

Franklin & Marshall College is one of the oldest institutions of higher learning in the United States. The College was founded in 1787 to bring culture and civility to what was then the Pennsylvania frontier. It began as Franklin College in the humble surroundings of a brew house on Mifflin Street, where the first classes were held on July 16, supported by a financial contribution from Benjamin Franklin. Other founders included four signers of the Declaration of Independence, three future governors of Pennsylvania, two members of the Constitutional Convention, and seven officers of the Revolutionary Army.

Since its founding, Franklin & Marshall has evolved through a series of transformative events into a nationally renowned liberal arts college that educates students from around the world. In 1853, Marshall College, a Mercersburg, Pa., institution named for Chief Justice John Marshall, moved to Lancaster to form Franklin & Marshall College. James Buchanan, 15th president of the United States, was the first president of the Board of Trustees. Beginning in its centennial year, the College added a strong program in science to its classical curriculum. Then, in the 1920s, it added a program in business. After World War II, a series of changes occurred that shaped the College into its present configuration. A longstanding connection to the German Reformed Church was severed and the College became a secular institution. The student body was no longer chiefly local, but became national and even international in scope. The numbers of students and faculty expanded, facilities were added, and the College became coeducational. Throughout all of these changes, the College remained committed to “liberal learning.”

Today, Franklin & Marshall proudly continues its dedication to intellectual freedom and critical learning. The College expects students to see connections, to discover community, and to understand the centrality of service to the human endeavor.

Professor Scott Lerner, a scholar of Italian and French literature and history, and an expert on the Jewish experience in 19th- and 20th-century Italy, blends intellectual rigor with exceptional teaching. For well over two decades, his pursuit of excellence and dedication to student success have made him a renowned teacher, mentor, and role model. He immerses students in language, encouraging them to explore themes like memory and trauma while honing their analysis of expression and storytelling.

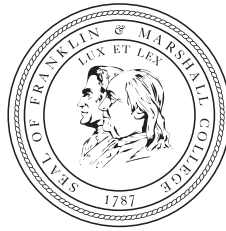
Professor Lerner fosters an approach to the humanities that prioritizes experiential learning. When he taught a course on the career of Napoleon, he asked his students to create an associated exhibit for the Phillips Museum of Art, using rare books and artifacts from F&M's Special Collections. This project reminded students of the materiality of history and provided a tangible framework for the knowledge they acquired. Furthermore, during a summer course on Sicilian writers taught in Tuscany, Professor Lerner co-led a trip to Sicily itself. By encountering both places directly, students learned to fully appreciate the contrasting socioeconomic realities depicted by authors who grew up in a rural setting and wrote about urban life.

When Professor Lerner developed a new direction for the F&M in Tuscany program, he chose an approach that stimulates historical understanding through role playing. Drawing on his archival research, he constructed a scenario based on a 19th-century conflict on the border between the Duchy of Tuscany and the Papal States, centered on Gentile Urbino, a 12-year-old Jewish girl allegedly kidnapped and transported to Rome in order to be baptized. Team-teaching with Professor Giovanna Faleschini Lerner, he led students in an intensive seminar to familiarize them with the history, theology, and political philosophy they would need in order to impersonate their character. He later adapted this exercise in historical imagination for use on campus in Lancaster. Students who have participated in reenacting the story of Gentile Urbino and her contemporaries describe the experience as deeply fulfilling, because it challenges them to set aside their own beliefs while grappling with complex questions of faith, politics, and identity. By providing students with the intellectual tools to connect the past to the present, Professor Lerner prepares them for the real-life role of informed and empathetic citizens who are sensitive to the historical roots of vexing circumstances and can consider intricate problems from multiple perspectives.

Through his many contributions to the general education curriculum and the Posse Program, and his mentoring of students and faculty members, Professor Lerner has helped to shape the collective identity of F&M. He represents the best of what it means to be an educator and scholar at this institution.

Professor John Modern is arguably the top — and inarguably among the top three — scholars of American religious history today. He is also among the foremost practitioners of an approach to Religious Studies that seeks to denaturalize seemingly naturalized conceptions about the place, role, and definition of religion in the modern world.

Professor Modern's scholarship combines the ferocity of a genealogist with razor-sharp analytical instincts with the painstaking patience of a rigorous historian who dazzles his audiences with his panoramic command over an archive. Much of Professor Modern's prolific scholarship has converged on the intellectual mission of questioning and rethinking the popular assumption that secularism represents the inverse, or the opposite, of religion. Throughout his voluminous publications, Modern shows and insists that secularism represents an often ineffable form of power that has shaped the widely held view that "good religion" is that which is consigned to inner piety and private belief.

Moreover, Professor Modern has argued — perhaps more forcefully and convincingly than any other scholar — that the very unquestioned common-sensicality of such a view of religion is itself indebted to the conditions, logics, and technologies of secular power.

His 2011 monograph "Secularism in Antebellum America" is perhaps the most widely debated and discussed book in the field of American religion. This book not only fundamentally reoriented our understanding of secularism in the modern American context, but it also showcased a model of methodological care, creativity — and indeed, courage — that dethroned existing orthodoxies of the field and inspired the research questions, vocabulary, and theoretical toolkit of the next generation of scholars of American religion. Professor Modern's more recent and award-winning 2021 book, "Neuromatic, Or, a Particular History of Religion and the Brain," examines the intimate entanglement of religion, secularism, and modern science, and is already destined to become a classic.

In addition to his extensive and deeply influential scholarship, Professor Modern is also the co-editor of the most prestigious book series in religious studies, "Class 200" from the University of Chicago Press, which has published some of the most consequential books in the field during the last decade.

Professor Modern is not only an exceptional scholar; he is also a maker of exceptional scholars.

During her nearly four decades at the College, Lisa Gasbarrone, Professor of French and Francophone Studies, richly enhanced Franklin & Marshall's quality of shared governance and campus life. Among her signal achievements, Professor Gasbarrone played a pivotal role in designing the International Studies program. In two terms as director, she held reading groups, inaugurated the Global Lunch series, partnered with students to raise human rights awareness, and organized campus visits of such notable figures as Rashid Khalidi, Nicholas Kristof, Raj Patel, Miroslav Wolf, and Nobel Prize winner Leymah Gbowee.

In 2005, Professor Gasbarrone collaborated with the Alice Drum Women's Center and the Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies program to sponsor the inaugural International Women's Week, which has since become a College tradition. A staunch advocate of off-campus study and experiential learning, Professor Gasbarrone served on the Board of International Field Experience, an academic internship program in Paris.

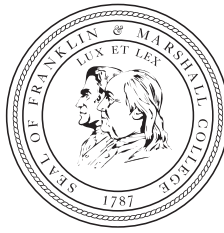
Professor Gasbarrone's lengthy list of administrative and committee responsibilities reflects her commitment to shared governance. Among other roles, her three terms as chair of the Department of French and Francophone Studies, her service on Faculty Council, and her leadership of the Budget Priorities Committee demonstrate her responsiveness and collegial spirit. In the words of Sean Flaherty, Professor Emeritus of Economics, "Lisa's was among the wisest of voices; she was always well-prepared, open-minded, and gracefully articulate in the expression of her understandings and opinions. She was, in short, a colleague to be emulated and admired."

Professor Gasbarrone's dedication as don of Brooks College House exemplified her commitment to student welfare and intellectual enrichment, culminating in initiatives addressing the College's history with slavery, the importance of language study, and contemporary challenges ranging from war in Ukraine to climate change, cultural diversity, and language loss. As Colette Shaw, Dean of Students, recollected, "Lisa began her don role in the early months of COVID. She immediately offered timely programming like the reading group for Camus' 'The Plague' and community building fireside chats. She led with her fearlessness and devotion."

In honor of the breadth, depth, collegiality, and creativity of her contributions, Professor Lisa Gasbarrone is a worthy recipient of the Distinguished Faculty Service Award.

Madeline Anderson is a Lancaster native and a media pioneer who is widely credited as the first Black woman to produce and direct a TV documentary. Her landmark documentary film, “Integration Report 1,” was televised in 1960 and chronicled the events leading to the first attempt at a civil rights march on Washington, D.C. Her next film, 1970’s “I Am Somebody,” told the story of African-American women hospital workers in Charleston, S.C., who went on strike to demand fair pay, unionization, and respect in the workplace.

Ms. Anderson enjoyed a long career in public television, helping to create such cultural touchstones as “Sesame Street” and “The Electric Company” for Children’s Television Workshop. She was the first Black employee at National Education Television (NET), where she helped create “Black Journal” with pioneering filmmaker William Greaves. She also is the first Black woman to executive produce and direct a nationwide syndicated TV series, the PBS educational program “Infinity Workshop.”

Ms. Anderson was one of the first Black women to join the Motion Picture Editors Guild. She was twice honored by the Sojourner Truth Festival of the Arts, first in 1970 and again in 2023. She is a member of the Black Filmmakers Hall of Fame and helped create what would become WHUT-TV at Howard University, the country’s first, and only, Black-owned public television station. Her works are archived at the Smithsonian Institution’s National Museum of African American History and Culture and the Library of Congress National Film Registry.

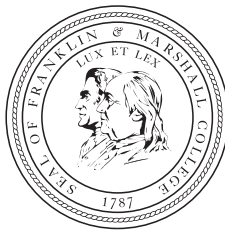
Ms. Anderson was born in southeastern Lancaster City’s 7th Ward neighborhood and often expressed her desire to become a filmmaker, but was told no Black women were Hollywood producers or directors. She graduated from J.P. McCaskey High School in 1945, then worked in a factory for two years to save enough money to move to New York City. There, she received a partial scholarship to New York University, where she earned her bachelor’s degree in psychology. She then decided to pursue her passion for film.

Today, Ms. Anderson lives in Brooklyn where, at age 96, she is directing and editing “I’m Still Standing,” a feature documentary about her life as a filmmaker, media pioneer, and activist.

Jason Cone, who graduated from Franklin & Marshall in 1999 with a joint major in biology and government, has more than 20 years' experience leading nonprofit organizations that respond to complex humanitarian crises, mount international and national social change advocacy campaigns, and manage security and risk incidents.

As the chief public policy officer of Robin Hood, New York City's largest anti-poverty philanthropic organization, Mr. Cone oversees a \$12 million grant-making portfolio tackling issues such as child poverty, criminal justice, affordable housing, child care, and tax policy reform.

Prior to working at Robin Hood, Mr. Cone worked at Doctors Without Borders/Medecins Sans Frontieres (MSF-USA) for 15 years. He completed his tenure at the organization as U.S. executive director, leading a staff of more than 200 with an annual budget of \$370 million. He led international communications and policy advocacy campaigns on childhood malnutrition, access to medicines, the global refugee crisis, and major epidemics, such as the West African Ebola epidemic and HIV/AIDS.

Mr. Cone was MSF-USA's chief liaison and negotiator with the Obama and Trump administrations on issues ranging from global health and counterterrorism to the protection of health care in conflict zones. After the 2022 invasion of Ukraine, while continuing to work at Robin Hood, he was among the co-founders of BlueCheck Ukraine, which has given more than \$4.2 million to local Ukrainian organizations providing emergency humanitarian aid. He is president of BlueCheck's board of directors.

Mr. Cone is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and an internationally recognized speaker and writer on global humanitarian issues. He has published essays and opinion pieces in *The New York Times*, *Time*, *Politico*, *Harvard International Review*, *Foreign Policy*, and other publications. He was nominated for a News & Documentary Emmy for his executive producer role on "Starved for Attention," a documentary series on childhood malnutrition.

Mr. Cone has completed programs on nonprofit leadership and public policy at Syracuse University's Maxwell School and the Harvard Kennedy School's Executive Education program. He lives in Rutherford, N.J., with his wife, Christie Del Rey-Cone, also a member of Franklin & Marshall's Class of 1999, and an employment attorney for NBC Universal, and with their two children, Anabella and Leo.

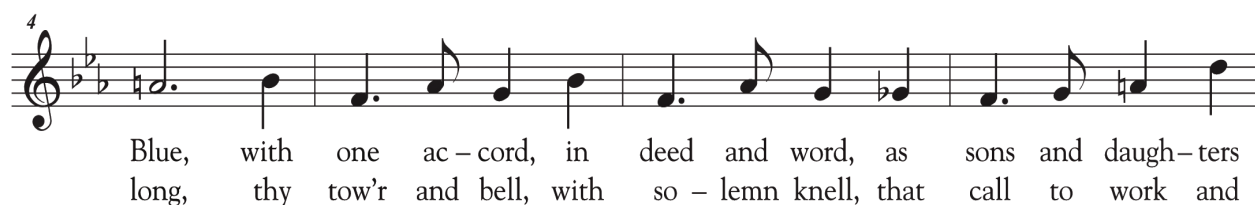

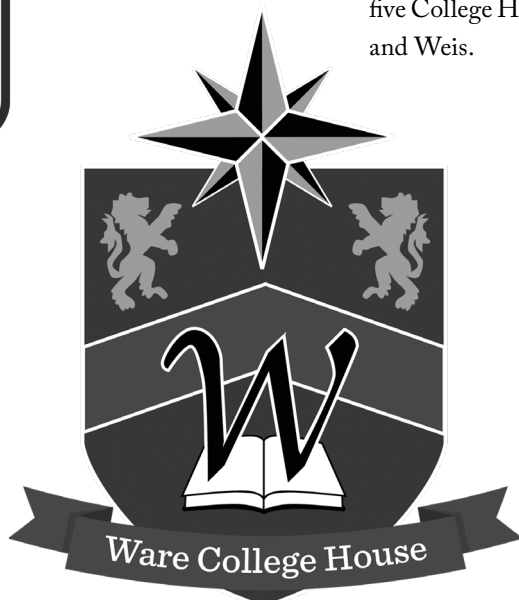

THE COLLEGE HOUSES



College Houses provide a crucial crossroads for faculty, students, distinguished visitors and alumni. They are “third spaces,” neither classrooms nor residential halls, that fill a need intimately connected with the nature of a liberal arts education. The Houses offer faculty and students a setting for chance encounters and informal moments, as well as scheduled opportunities that spark students’ potential, engage their intellectual imaginations, and connect them with alumni and current and future notables in environments that are stimulating, comfortable, and educational in the deepest sense.

The Houses are the meeting ground where students can interact and network among the extended College family. On any given day, students might encounter a government official, visiting alumni, distinguished scholars, candidates interviewing for positions at the College, faculty hosting small discussions, or CEOs looking for talent. Students create and host social events that bring them together with other members of the House and with the extended F&M community.

In these ways, the House environment integrates thoughtful deliberation and intellectual exploration into students’ daily lives. This frequent engagement with ideas and exposure to disparate views helps students to form habits of thought and analysis that will vitalize their professional and personal lives. There are currently five College Houses: Bonchek, Brooks, Roschel, Ware, and Weis.

THE COLLEGE MACE

The maple and poplar College Mace was designed by Professor Edmund Whiting, chair of the Department of Art at Franklin & Marshall College, in 1967–68 and created by J.E. Brubaker Pattern Works, formerly of Landisville, Pa. The mace is a replica of the four-spired tower of Old Main, one of the oldest buildings on campus. Inside the mace is a piece of an oak beam taken from the North Queen Street building where Franklin College established its quarters in 1788, less than a year after its founding. Since it was presented to the College by the Alumni Association at Franklin & Marshall's 189th Commencement on Sunday, June 11, 1967, the mace has become an official emblem of the College at ceremonial events.

THE ALUMNI TORCH

On the occasion of its 20th reunion in 1924, the Class of 1904 presented the College with a ceremonial torch, principally for use at Commencement. The members of the class hoped to create a new tradition in which the torch would be ceremonially handed from the Alumni Board president to the president of the senior class. This literal and symbolic “passing of the torch” was intended to welcome the newest graduates into the ranks of alumni.

For more than 75 years, this tradition was a centerpiece of Commencement. Unfortunately, the torch disappeared during the 2000 ceremony and has never been found. The Alumni Association, with the help of the Class of 2004 (in a fitting tribute to its predecessors of a century before), commissioned the creation of a new torch that is an exact replica of the original. This tradition has now been renewed.

THE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Founded in 1840, the Alumni Association of Franklin & Marshall College is one of the oldest in the country. It initially served as an intellectual society for graduates, who each year designated one of their members “Orator” and listened to his remarks on some current issue or philosophical problem at the annual meeting.

As the College evolved, so did the association. Following the merger of Franklin College and Marshall College in 1853, members of the original Marshall Association enthusiastically pledged themselves to their new institution. In 1874, the association incorporated in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Regional chapters were soon formed, beginning in 1887 in Philadelphia, followed by the Southern Association (in Maryland) in 1890, the Lancaster chapter in 1894 and the Eastern Association (in Reading) in 1900. In the first decades of the 20th century, the association grew in size and in its ambitions. By 1937, there were 17 chapters across the country, including New York City, Baltimore, Washington, D.C., and as far west as Cleveland and Chicago.

The Franklin & Marshall Alumni Association today boasts chapters across the United States and hosts activities around the world. It serves approximately 26,000 alumni—who hold leadership positions in virtually every profession—through networking opportunities, social events, cultural programs and a dedicated career-services officer who provides alumni with support in areas such as career advisement, job placement, and job strategy assistance and skills assessment.

The Alumni Association also works to enhance the experience of current students. The board of directors of the Alumni Association supports two scholarships, hosts a celebration each Commencement weekend for graduates and, in recent years, has made important financial contributions to key strategic initiatives of the College.

Though times change, the spirit of the Alumni Association's mission endures: “to advance the welfare of the College and its alumni by engaging alumni in the life of their alma mater; fostering and strengthening the connections between and among alumni, students and the rest of the College community; and inspiring in alumni and students a lifelong sense of loyalty toward, pride in, and support of the College.”
