HISTORY *of the* COLLEGE

Franklin & Marshall College is one of the oldest institutions of higher learning in the United States. The College was founded in 1787 to bring culture and civility to what was then the Pennsylvania frontier. It began as Franklin College in the humble surroundings of a brew house on Mifflin Street, where the first classes were held on July 16, supported by a financial contribution from Benjamin Franklin. Other founders included four signers of the Declaration of Independence, three future governors of Pennsylvania, two members of the Constitutional Convention, and seven officers of the Revolutionary Army.

Since its founding, Franklin & Marshall has evolved through a series of transformative events into a nationally renowned liberal arts college that educates students from around the world. In 1853, Marshall College, a Mercersburg, Pa., institution named for Chief Justice John Marshall, moved to Lancaster to form Franklin & Marshall College. James Buchanan, 15th president of the United States, was the first president of the Board of Trustees. Beginning in its centennial year, the College added a strong program in science to its classical curriculum. Then, in the 1920s, it added a program in business. After World War II, a series of changes occurred that shaped the College into its present configuration. A longstanding connection to the German Reformed Church was severed and the College became a secular institution. The student body was no longer chiefly local, but became national and even international in scope. The numbers of students and faculty expanded, facilities were added, and the College became coeducational. Throughout all of these changes, the College remained committed to “liberal learning.”

Today, Franklin & Marshall proudly continues its dedication to intellectual freedom and critical learning. The College expects students to see connections, to discover community, and to understand the centrality of service to the human endeavor.

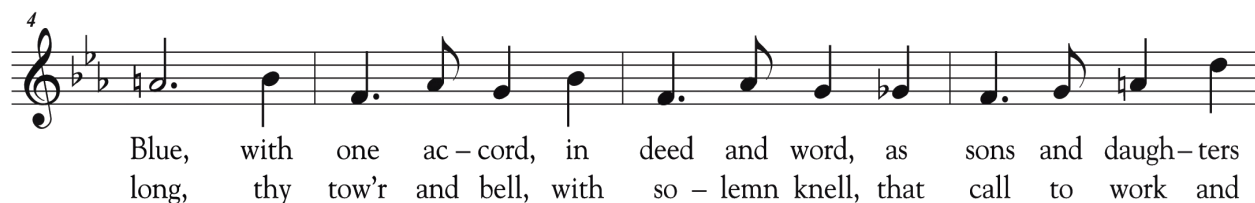

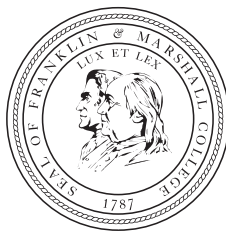

Professor Meredith Bashaw is a tireless champion for learners and scientists of all backgrounds and levels. On campus, you are likely to find her supervising one of her many undergraduate research assistants, staying late to meet with a student, or leading a workshop about best practices in teaching for her colleagues.

Professor Bashaw is one of the nation's top scholars in animal welfare, particularly concerning wild animals in captivity. She has authored or co-authored more than 35 peer-reviewed articles and one highly regarded edited volume, "Scientific Foundations of Zoos and Aquariums," published by Cambridge University Press. She has received significant grants to support her research from the Association of Zoos and Aquariums and other organizations, as well as many awards for her scholarship, such as the Susan D. Chan Author of the Year Award and the Keeper Appreciation Award.

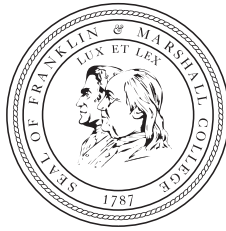
At the same time, her department colleagues and peers across campus look to her for guidance on the development of innovative curricula and pedagogy. Professor Bashaw led the revision of the Psychology major and minor and the Animal Behavior major. She consistently seeks out training in inclusive pedagogy from national experts and then generously shares what she has learned with other professors at F&M. For example, she was selected to attend the Project Kaleidoscope STEM Leadership Institute and the American Association of Colleges and Universities' High Impact Practices for Student Success Institute. With funding from the Arthur Vining Davis Foundation, she ran a summer workshop for colleagues on "Capitalizing on Diversity to Enhance the Liberal Arts Classroom Experience." Professor Bashaw also impressed her colleagues when she was a co-leader of the Faculty Center Inclusive Teaching Workshop. Here, she helped others make their syllabi and assignments more transparent and use language that encouraged resilience among learners. With wisdom, humility, and humor, Professor Bashaw encouraged senior and junior colleagues to join her in this important work.

Professor Bashaw has high standards in her classes; she is known as a tough grader. Students describe her as "always well-prepared," "extraordinarily engaging," "precise," "meticulous," and "thorough." Embracing the F&M ethos of student-faculty collaboration to solve real-world problems, Professor Bashaw consistently supervises students' independent research and includes them in her own scholarly projects.

Students and faculty across the College have benefited from Professor Bashaw's expertise and excellence in teaching. She is a beloved mentor who truly leads by example.

Alison Kibler is a model of scholarly excellence at a liberal arts college. She is a widely published leader in American cultural history, a public historian whose community-based projects draw in a large number of Franklin & Marshall College students, and she serves in a quiet mentoring role for pre-tenure colleagues, especially in their scholarly development.

Professor Kibler's prolific scholarship record of the past three decades is, indeed, impressive. In addition to her many peer-reviewed journal articles, she published two books with the University of North Carolina Press: "Censoring Racial Ridicule: Irish, Jewish and African American Struggles over Race and Representation, 1890-1930" (2015) and "Rank Ladies: Gender and Cultural Hierarchy in American Vaudeville" (1999). The considerable fellowship and grant support for her projects, including those from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Rockefeller Foundation, the ACLS, and the Australian Academy of the Humanities, is testimony to her stellar reputation. Her current book project, *Liberate the Media: Feminist Television Activism in the 1970s*, has received funding to visit archives in Baltimore, the Schlesinger Library at Harvard, and Smith College's archives.

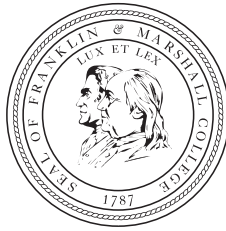
Professor Kibler's steadfast commitment to community-engaged scholarship is at the center of her work. In the mid-2000s, she undertook research about the desegregation of County Pool in Lancaster and published two pieces about that issue. Her current multimedia project, *Lancaster Vice*, serves as a history of the anti-vice campaign in Lancaster in the early 20th century during a period in which the city was known as "wide-open" with a flourishing commercial sex trade and a vibrant gay male subculture. The project includes developing a walking tour, which she now leads, and a podcast.

Almost all of her research engages our students, as Hackman Scholars or research assistants. She is extremely committed to training young scholars. She takes time to train teams of students and engage them actively in every phase of her projects. She truly loves the research process and wants to impart this love to a new generation of historians.

Alison Kibler is a model citizen of the campus and community. Her expansive practice of scholarship truly fulfills the Bradley R. Dewey Scholarship Award criteria of a faculty member, "whose research efforts reflect and inspire excellence, and enlighten teaching."

For more than 40 years, Katherine McClelland has embodied the spirit and practice of shared governance at Franklin & Marshall College. A tireless member of dozens of committees, task forces, and working groups, Professor McClelland has spearheaded numerous initiatives to improve campus life with a focus on student welfare and learning. In 1991, she was honored by the Christian R. and Mary E. Lindback Foundation for outstanding teaching. Today, the College recognizes her extraordinary record of service.

With a longstanding research interest in race relations on college campuses, Professor McClelland has lent her scholarly expertise and organizational talent to facilitating community. A founding member and chair of the Africana Studies program, Professor McClelland served many years on the Presidential Task Force on Diversity and Inclusiveness, played an instrumental role in designing the College's Day of Dialogue programs, and co-founded and convened the Race Matters Discussion Forum, a vital platform for campus conversations from 2001 to 2006.

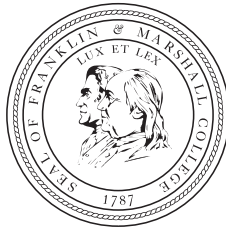
Professor McClelland has also been a devoted member of the Department of Sociology, spending a total of 11 years at its helm. The esteem in which her fellow faculty members hold her is evident in her election to major governance committees, including the Educational Policy Committee, the Professional Standards Committee, and Faculty Council, which she chaired twice. Colleagues regard as particularly valuable Professor McClelland's service on the Professional Standards Committee and the Academic Affairs Advisory Task Force as they navigated the College's profound challenges during the first years of COVID-19.

It is not simply the number of service opportunities that Professor McClelland has taken up, but the quality of her contributions that stands out. Widely recognized as both principled and practical, Professor McClelland does not leave onerous duties to others, but volunteers, fills gaps, proposes solutions, and follows through – all without drawing attention to her efforts and accomplishments. Conscientious, consultative, and unfailingly cheerful, Professor McClelland is a model committee member and chair. If her energy is seemingly limitless, so too are her compassion, thoughtfulness, and understanding.

For all of these reasons and more, Katherine McClelland is a highly deserving recipient of the 2025 Distinguished Faculty Service Award.

Danene Sorace is the 43rd mayor of the city of Lancaster, Pennsylvania. She has served as the city's mayor since her election in 2018, winning re-election in 2021. She is only the second woman to serve as Lancaster's mayor and brings a background as a nonprofit leader, environmental advocate, and former Lancaster City Council member, where she chaired the Finance Committee.

As mayor, she has set forth a vision of building a stronger, more equitable Lancaster block by block. Mayor Sorace's administration is focused on four strategic priorities: strong neighborhoods, safe places, a sustainable economy, and sound government. Key accomplishments include launching the Department of Neighborhood Engagement to elevate neighborhoods and empower residents, securing record grant funding to remediate lead in homes and promote safe streets, achieving the Welcoming City designation, and making historic investments in affordable housing.

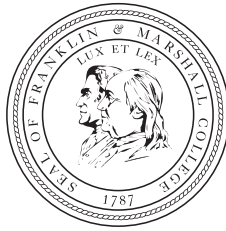
Mayor Sorace is a leader beyond Lancaster, serving as past president of the Pennsylvania Municipal League and as Chair of the U.S. Conference of Mayors Water Council. She has received the Governor's Award for Local Government Excellence twice, most recently in April 2025 for her work leading the city's adoption of a Home Rule Charter. She also completed the Bloomberg Harvard City Leadership Initiative and was featured in Politico's Mayors Club series.

Mayor Sorace and Franklin & Marshall President Barbara Altmann have enjoyed a close professional relationship and personal friendship over the last seven years. The mayor credits F&M as a key partner in the city's ongoing vitality and efforts to nurture community engagement. Mayor Sorace earned her bachelor's degree from Albright College and her master's degree in public policy from Rutgers University. She is married to Christian and, together with daughter Aurelia, enjoys hiking, travel and dining out in Lancaster's many fabulous restaurants.

Lancaster native Jonathan Groff, who has earned a Tony Award and a Grammy Award, grew up only a few miles east of the F&M campus. He is a graduate of Conestoga Valley High School and has taken part in many community productions in Lancaster, including several plays at the Fulton Theater and the Ephrata Performing Arts Center. At 17, he directed and starred in the production of “You’re a Good Man, Charlie Brown” that won the highest award at an annual high school theater festival at the Fulton.

After moving to New York City, Mr. Groff’s breakout performance was in 2006, when he starred in the Broadway production of the poignant and complex rock musical, “Spring Awakening.” That production earned him his first Tony nomination, for Best Actor in a Leading Role in a Musical. From 2010 to 2016, he was a frequent guest star in the Fox TV series, “Glee.” He occasionally appears in TV and streaming productions on platforms including HBO and Netflix, and was a guest star in last year’s 14th season of “Doctor Who.” In 2013, he voiced Kristoff in Disney’s animated feature, “Frozen,” which won an Academy Award and a Golden Globe Award and was the year’s highest-grossing film. He reprised that role in 2019 for “Frozen II.”

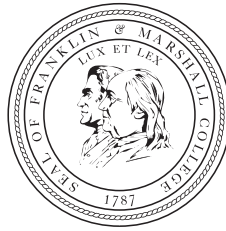
In 2015, Mr. Groff joined the cast of the hit musical, “Hamilton,” playing the unforgettable role of King George III. The play earned 11 Tony Awards and a Grammy Award for Best Musical Theater Album. He was nominated for a Tony Award for Best Featured Actor in a Musical. Mr. Groff earned the Tony Award for Best Performance by a Leading Actor in a Musical last year with his portrayal of Franklin Shepard in the revival of Stephen Sondheim’s “Merrily We Roll Along.” He currently stars in the Broadway production of “Just in Time,” a musical about Bobby Darin.

Mr. Groff has collaborated with F&M students, alumni and faculty, especially those associated with the Philadelphia Alumni Writers House. He has joined them virtually, to answer questions about the theater, and participated in a recent panel discussion organized by the Writers House in New York City. The panel was moderated by James Lapine, a 1971 Franklin & Marshall graduate and a three-time Tony Award winning director, playwright and screenwriter.

Sandra Cisneros is a noted author and activist who is a dual citizen of the United States and Mexico. She is a poet, short story writer, novelist, essayist, author of children's books, performer and artist who has focused much of her work on the lives of the working class in the U.S.

Perhaps best known for her book, "The House on Mango Street," Ms. Cisneros has earned fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts in both poetry and fiction, the American Book Award, a National Medal of Arts, and the Ford Foundation's Art of Change Fellowship, among other awards. This year, the National Book Critics Circle awarded her the Ivan Sandrof Lifetime Achievement Award.

Ms. Cisneros is no stranger to the Franklin & Marshall campus. She was selected as F&M's Mueller Fellow in November 2019. That fellowship was established in 1980 to bring distinguished national speakers to F&M and lead conversations about important issues with the campus community. Her visit, which included discussions with student organizations and in academic classes, culminated in her campus address, "A River of Voices: Documenting the Undocumented." She performed a dramatic work based on interviews she conducted with individuals across the country to gather their ideas about how to bridge the increasing divide among people's views on immigration policy.

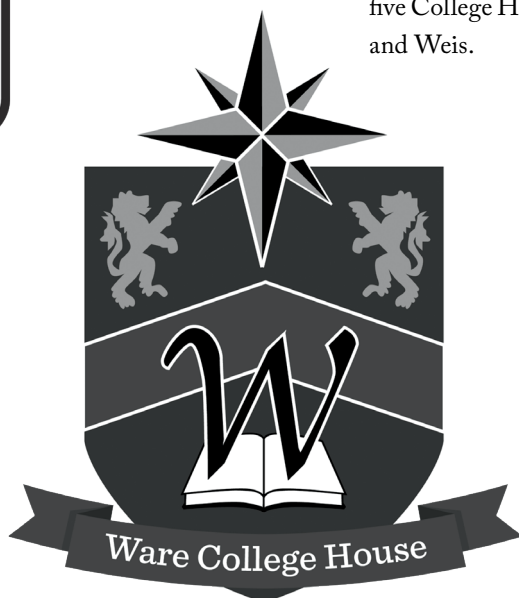
Ms. Cisneros was born in Chicago, the only daughter in a family of seven children. She now lives in the central Mexican city of San Miguel de Allende. She earned her bachelor's degree in English at Loyola University of Chicago and her master's degree in creative writing at the University of Iowa. She has worked as a teacher and counselor to high-school dropouts, a creative writing teacher in elementary school, a college recruiter, an arts administrator, and a visiting writer at several universities, including the University of California, Berkeley, and the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor.

THE COLLEGE HOUSES



College Houses provide a crucial crossroads for faculty, students, distinguished visitors and alumni. They are “third spaces,” neither classrooms nor residential halls, that fill a need intimately connected with the nature of a liberal arts education. The Houses offer faculty and students a setting for chance encounters and informal moments, as well as scheduled opportunities that spark students’ potential, engage their intellectual imaginations, and connect them with alumni and current and future notables in environments that are stimulating, comfortable, and educational in the deepest sense.

The Houses are the meeting ground where students can interact and network among the extended College family. On any given day, students might encounter a government official, visiting alumni, distinguished scholars, candidates interviewing for positions at the College, faculty hosting small discussions, or CEOs looking for talent. Students create and host social events that bring them together with other members of the House and with the extended F&M community.

In these ways, the House environment integrates thoughtful deliberation and intellectual exploration into students’ daily lives. This frequent engagement with ideas and exposure to disparate views helps students to form habits of thought and analysis that will vitalize their professional and personal lives. There are currently five College Houses: Bonchek, Brooks, Roschel, Ware, and Weis.

THE COLLEGE MACE

The maple and poplar College Mace was designed by Professor Edmund Whiting, chair of the Department of Art at Franklin & Marshall College, in 1967–68 and created by J.E. Brubaker Pattern Works, formerly of Landisville, Pa. The mace is a replica of the four-spired tower of Old Main, one of the oldest buildings on campus. Inside the mace is a piece of an oak beam taken from the North Queen Street building where Franklin College established its quarters in 1788, less than a year after its founding. Since it was presented to the College by the Alumni Association at Franklin & Marshall's 189th Commencement on Sunday, June 11, 1967, the mace has become an official emblem of the College at ceremonial events.

THE ALUMNI TORCH

On the occasion of its 20th reunion in 1924, the Class of 1904 presented the College with a ceremonial torch, principally for use at Commencement. The members of the class hoped to create a new tradition in which the torch would be ceremonially handed from the Alumni Board president to the president of the senior class. This literal and symbolic “passing of the torch” was intended to welcome the newest graduates into the ranks of alumni.

For more than 75 years, this tradition was a centerpiece of Commencement. Unfortunately, the torch disappeared during the 2000 ceremony and has never been found. The Alumni Association, with the help of the Class of 2004 (in a fitting tribute to its predecessors of a century before), commissioned the creation of a new torch that is an exact replica of the original. This tradition has now been renewed.

THE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Founded in 1840, the Alumni Association of Franklin & Marshall College is one of the oldest in the country. It initially served as an intellectual society for graduates, who each year designated one of their members “Orator” and listened to his remarks on some current issue or philosophical problem at the annual meeting.

As the College evolved, so did the association. Following the merger of Franklin College and Marshall College in 1853, members of the original Marshall Association enthusiastically pledged themselves to their new institution. In 1874, the association incorporated in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Regional chapters were soon formed, beginning in 1887 in Philadelphia, followed by the Southern Association (in Maryland) in 1890, the Lancaster chapter in 1894 and the Eastern Association (in Reading) in 1900. In the first decades of the 20th century, the association grew in size and in its ambitions. By 1937, there were 17 chapters across the country, including New York City, Baltimore, Washington, D.C., and as far west as Cleveland and Chicago.

The Franklin & Marshall Alumni Association today boasts chapters across the United States and hosts activities around the world. It serves approximately 26,000 alumni—who hold leadership positions in virtually every profession—through networking opportunities, social events, cultural programs and a dedicated career-services officer who provides alumni with support in areas such as career advisement, job placement, and job strategy assistance and skills assessment.

The Alumni Association also works to enhance the experience of current students. The board of directors of the Alumni Association supports two scholarships, hosts a celebration each Commencement weekend for graduates and, in recent years, has made important financial contributions to key strategic initiatives of the College.

Though times change, the spirit of the Alumni Association's mission endures: “to advance the welfare of the College and its alumni by engaging alumni in the life of their alma mater; fostering and strengthening the connections between and among alumni, students and the rest of the College community; and inspiring in alumni and students a lifelong sense of loyalty toward, pride in, and support of the College.”
